## The Parade

The parade, which commemorates the official birthday of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, is the last to be held in Cyprus under British sovereignty.

Similar parades are being held to-day in all parts of the Commonwealth and at each the Queen is deemed to attend, her "arrival" and "departure" being marked by the breaking and lowering of the Royal Standard. During this period the Inspecting Officer leaves the dais and joins the parade as it pays honour to the Sovereign.

The main events, after the parade has assembled, are as follows:-

Arrival of the Commissioner.

General Salute.

Inspection.

March Past in Line and re-form.

"Arrival" of the Sovereign (Royal Standard flown).

Royal Salute.

Fly Past by the Royal Air Force.

Gun Salute and Feu de Joie.

Three Cheers for Her Majesty.

Royal Salute.

"Departure" of the Sovereign (Royal Standard lowered).

March Past in Column of Route and March off.

Drive Past of Vehicles.

Departure of the Commissioner.

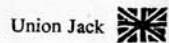
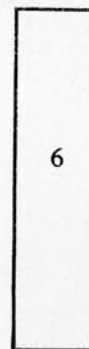
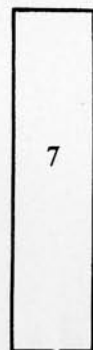
# Diagrammatic Layout of The Parade



Colours of 1 Devon/Dorset



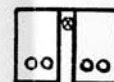
